

## **MINUTES of a meeting of Landulph Parish Council held on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February 2010 at 7.30pm in the Landulph Memorial Hall Annexe, Landulph.**

**PRESENT** – Councillor A Butcher (Chairman), Councillors Mrs G Braund, Mrs R Cradick, R Creagh-Osborne, G Lipscomb and G. Stevenson plus the Clerk to the Council C.R.Harris.

**Also present:-** Cornwall Councillor Mrs O.Eggleston and PC Rachel Short.

### **A SHORT PUBLIC FORUM PRECEDED THE MAIN MEETING.**

#### **86 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE**

Apologies for absence were submitted on behalf of Councillor Mrs T. West.

#### **87 CORNWALL COUNCIL REPORT**

Councillor Mrs O.Eggleston reported that any number of Parish Councillors could attend the CNA meeting but only two from each cluster/town could vote. Councillor Mrs Eggleston reported that it would be decided at a cluster meeting who could vote. The Chairman suggested that a meeting of the cluster should be convened prior to the next meeting of the CNA. Councillor Mrs Eggleston suggested that the reasoning behind the two-vote proposal was to maintain a balance amongst the groups. The Chairman voiced disappointment at the proposed relocation of Cornwall Council offices from Liskeard to Bodmin without any consultation with parishes or towns in East Cornwall. Councillor Mrs Eggleston agreed suggesting that the east of the county would become more isolated. It was resolved that this Council would write to Cornwall Council voicing disappointment at the lack of consultation on the proposals to relocate offices from Liskeard to Bodmin. On the subject of street lights in Hodders Way Councillor Mrs Eggleston reported that the lights were in situ for safety and security reasons. Councillor Mrs Eggleston reported on sheltered accommodation in Hodders way and reported that the majority of residents did not want the lights extinguished at night. Members ventured that a previous consultation had produced a different result in that residents wished to have the lights extinguished during the early hours of the morning. It was also noted that the sheltered accommodation only accounted for some of the residents in Hodders Way.

#### **88 POLICE REPORT**

PC Rachel Short introduced herself as the local Neighbourhood Beat Manager. PC Short offered to attend as many meetings as possible and could be contacted in Saltash police station or on the web. It was reported that two crimes had been committed in the parish during January, that of heating oil theft and of a lawnmower from a shed at the back of the Methodist Church. PC Short urged residents to be vigilant especially those using heating oil during this cold spell. PC Short announced attendance at the Pentillie House event on the 14<sup>th</sup> March and will be around the village on the 20<sup>th</sup> April.

(PC Short was thanked for her report and left the meeting).

#### **86 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING**

The minutes of the meeting held on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2010 were taken as read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

#### **87 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES**

##### **a) Parish Plan:-**

Pursuant to minute 81 Councillor G. Stevenson gave a précis of the previous month's debate and confirmed that the steering group would be formed at the Parish Assembly (Parish Meeting) in March. It was suggested that a Cornwall Council officer could be in attendance at the meeting to advise and guide on this matter.

##### **b) Any Other Business:-**

Pursuant to minute 84 Councillor G. Stevenson raised the issue of recycling and collections in the parish. Councillor Mrs O.Eggleston confirmed that the contract is due for renewal this year and that Council's will be consulted. Councillor Stevenson ventured that the councils should be consulted prior to the contract being renewed. It was resolved that a letter would be sent to Cornwall Council requesting that Council's are consulted prior to the negotiations to renew the contract. Pursuant to minute 84 it was confirmed that the current locations of Cornwall Council grit bins are the Bus Shelter at Landulph Cross, Clampit Hill and Hodders Way. It was suggested that a bin in the Memorial Hall car park might also be beneficial.
